Dear People of Christ,

I thought I might talk about Fridays or staff support. But no, that's for other places in this newsletter. (See: *Time Away for the Pastors* and *Important Conversations*.) What I want to talk to you about comes from a recent council meeting and from worship: "What is the business of this church?"

In council I described it as simply one beggar telling another beggar where to find the bread. In my sermon I asked those there to say to the person beside them, "Jesus is my Lord." Each time my heart was warmed by the people of Christ Church.

At council those words did not fall on deaf ears; at worship many were not satisfied with one other person, but went to another and then another with the same words until there was a gentle time of conversation.

Why have we been together for so long? I can only think it is because we have the same core value: We are here to live and tell of Jesus. We have been through enough to know that this is not an easy nor straightforward task. There are personal agendas and dramas (we all have them) that get in the way. But in spite of these, we keep coming back to the same purpose; we are here to be Christ at Christ and beyond Christ. Mark writes:

*Jesus came into Galilee, preaching the good news of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent, and believe in the good news."*

Let me change it a bit to fit our context:

*And we came to Lakeside, telling of and living the good news of God: repentance and forgiveness; faith and hope in the good news who is Jesus Christ.*

We are here to be Christ at Christ Church and beyond Christ Church.

How do you get to Pastor Kristin and me with your concerns? The easiest way is by talking to us.

A standard as pastors is that whatever you have to say, you are able to say it without our being judgmental toward you. Lutheran pastors realize that we all fall short of God's glory (pastors too). So as you come to us, you are coming to a fellow "sinner of God's redeeming." Also there is confidentiality. What is spoken is kept in that place and time, not to be repeated by you or the pastor.

But sometimes that may be difficult for you to do. So Christ Church has another vehicle for conversation. Over the years it has had many names: our constitution calls it the "Staff Support Committee;" synod calls it a "Mutual Ministry Committee;" when we approve a revised constitution, it is slated to be called "Support of Ministry Committee." And we have chosen to include other staff that desire to connect with the committee.

Whatever it is called, the purpose is the same; it is committed to:

- 1.) Be a sounding board for the staff
- 2.) Be a sounding board for members in the congregation
- 3.) Be a conduit for connecting staff and members

## TIME AWAY FOR THE PASTORS

Lots of things I hear only second-hand. Sometimes it's that a member is sick or needs something; other times it's something on someone's mind. Here's one item: Time off for the pastors.

There is the reality of overlapping days away because of meetings, conferences, continuing education events and vacation. We try very hard to not let this happen, but sometimes it just does.

But the bottom line is: We make sure those days are covered. Fortunately, we have two other pastors in our church, a parish nurse and pastors in the area who are more than happy to help.

Then, there is the other item: Pastor Kristin and I are scheduled to take Fridays off. First of all, it is not a given that we do get a day off in the week. Funerals, weddings, emergencies and church events come to mind.

Why have we chosen the same day? Here are three realities:

- 1.) The natural flow of a church week does start on Sunday.
- 2.) Council, Staff and many ministries meet Mondays.
- 3.) If one of us takes Monday off, for that person it means a day lost for meetings and visits. (What member wants a Friday evening meeting? Who wants a Friday visit when most members are trying to get things caught up to have the weekend?)

What have we done to make sure there is coverage? Pastors are always on call, 24/7. However, to ensure some break, Pastor Kristin and I split coverage between us on weekends (including Fridays). If you call, a pastor will respond to your call.

And when the office is closed (holidays and Katy's vacation days), we still cover those days. But remember to call the church office because your pastors don't wait in the office for someone who just might stop by; we are out serving you.

## *From the Parish Nurse...*

In the Chinese culture, the New Year is the time dedicated to finish with the old and to start with the new. Their traditions include visiting friends and family to re-establish relationships, cleaning the house to prepare for the coming year, stocking cupboards with household provisions, settling all old debts, and putting forth their best behavior. All of these activities are to make the new year better and healthier. October is not our culture's new year, but it strikes me that as we start a busy new church year, we have many opportunities to think about our health.

What are you doing for your health? Are you going to keep all of your old habits and ignore healthier ones? For example have you considered limiting your meals at fast-food restaurants? Can you develop healthier choices at the grocery store? Will you improve your exercise habits by walking or joining a health club? Have you considered the health benefits of practicing self-care and a well-balanced life-style? Any and all of these will guide you to a healthier life.

Every 6 months or 15,000 miles, a car is taken in for a checkup and regular maintenance so why don't you do the same for your body? God gave you one body and the responsibility of keeping it healthy and strong. It is up to you to watch over it and pay attention to signs that you need a checkup. If you have a lump in your breast, a mole that changes shape or color, sudden shortness of breath, or stools that are not usual, don't wait. Visit your doctor and have the appropriate screenings to find the problem and the right treatment. The longer you wait, the more advanced a situation or disease will become and the harder it will be to deal with it.

Besides improving your physical health, what can you do to improve your mental and spiritual health? What are your interests? Take a look at opportunities in the ministries of our church, start a new ministry if one is lacking, or find an opportunity to share your gifts in the community. Good health is more than eating right; it is sharing the love of Jesus Christ by sharing your time and talents. Giving of yourself benefits the recipient as well as you. It improves your mental health by focusing on others rather than yourself and grows your spiritual life as you demonstrate your faith, so start volunteering today!

I hope you will contact me if I can be of help to you on your health journey. I also hope you will consider attending Lakeside HealthCARE's first Open House Health Fair on October 22. You will find more information about it in this newsletter and will hear more about it in the weeks to come. Drop in for a short or long visit and visit with the folks who are eager to share information with you and tell you about their services.
